Community Mobilization

KIRAN society works for the education of children with disabilities and from marginalized communities in Mirzapur and Varanasi districts.

Programs objective is to make quality education accessible for children with disabilities and from marginalized communities. 7 parents and children meetings were organized. 361 parents were sensitized toward a better education for their children and all the government schemes and facilities that are being provided to them. 62 parents have started to visit schools regularly they have conducted several meetings with teachers.

Walk in to Hope

Kartik is a 6-year-old boy, affected with locomotor disability. He studies in a primary school in his village. He is depended on others for his day to day activities. KIRAN's grassroots worker suggested them to visit Kiran Centre. After some persuasion, she finally agreed to visit local Kiran Camp at Bhojubeer. Specialist doctors recommended surgery for his leg. With help from KIRAN, his operation becomes possible with the minimum financial burden on his parents. On August 01, 2018 he was successfully operated. KIRAN took care of post-surgery medical care. He was provided with a suitable appliance and gait training. Now Kartik can walk on his own.



The District Level Workshop

The aim of workshop was to mobilize the Special educators, rehabilitation professionals and local authorities.
